

Happy holidays from Missoula and the Mount Jumbo Elk Herd

Greetings from Missoula! I've been thinking a lot about our conference theme lately and

there is no better reminder in Missoula of how to manage growing recreation pressure in an urban area then to look up at Mt Jumbo in the winter. Mt Jumbo is a cornerstone of Missoula's open space system, and includes over 1600 acres of city, FWP, and FS lands. This area was purchased and set aside in the 1990s by a forward-looking group of folks working through FWP, Missoula City, US Forest Service, Five Valleys Land Trust, and the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation. The goal was to "ensure preservation of the mountain's natural resources and to provide for compatible recreation." Hundreds of hikers, dog walkers, mountain bikers, and paragliders enjoy Mt Jumbo for much of the year. But come December 1st it closes to the public and belongs to the elk. There are many days in the winter you can look up from downtown Missoula and see the elk grazing out on Mt Jumbo. Now that's the best gift there is. As we reflect back on the past year, I want to say thanks to each of you for all you do to help make a place for wildlife. There's a lot to be proud of.
